

Biking round in the City and its Vicinity





Biking round Balatonalmádi and its Vicinity

Balatonalmádi is located on a picturesque part of the northern shore of Lake Balaton. The shores are encircled by sandstone hills from where there is a wonderful view at the lake. Balatonalmádi is the fourth largest resort along the lake and belongs to the "Balaton Riviére". It is a special joy to cycle around the township. Due to its geographical location Balatonalmádi is the starting point of quite a few tours. Reading over the different suggestions for bike tours of various difficulty-level and the beauty-spots listed everybody can choose the exact route to his or her taste, interest and ability.

Our township is rich in beauty-spots and it is time you became familar with them. Jump on your bike and follow us!

BIKING ROUND THE TOWNSHIP:

There are 9 kilometres long bike route and 10 kilometres long bike-friendly route sections in Balatonalmádi. You can approach the township from 4 directions:

- 1. Budapest- Balatonfűzfő
- 2. Balatonfüred
- 3. Felsőörs
- 4. Veszprém-Szentkirályszabadja

Coming from Veszprém we will reach the Remete Valley, Springs and Határ Street, then Kisberény Street bike-route. Turning left we can reach the Calvinist Fortified Church and the Saint Ignatius Roman Catholic Church with a short loop across Balázs Béla and Ady Streets, and bit farther off we can see the Home of Hungarian Wines and the Wine Museum. Biking downhill from Veszprémi Road we turn left to reach the bike-route along Árpád Street,


Kövesalja Street and Balatonfűzfő Road. Biking along the shore we will get to the Boat Harbour and the Old Park where we can see the Music Pavilion, the Bridge of Sighs, Eternal Flame, precious busts, monuments and plant rarities. Biking on towards Káptalanfüred we will get to the Open-air Chapel.

If we choose to visit the downtown area then we bike downhill following the Veszprémi Road from Vörösberény and we can see a buquet of beauty-spots. Our first stop is at the Saint Margaret Chapel at the Marketplace then we can get to the downtown across Széchenyi Promenade. Some of the sights worth seeing include the memorial columns of the one-time Zsák Restaurant, Millennium Cross, the statue of Pannonia Aqua, the starting point of the Red Sandstone Tourist Path, Hungary's Relief Map carved out of red sandstone, the Town Hall, the Pannonia Cultural Centre and Library with the Tourinform Office downstairs.

Biking farther to north we can have a look at the Calvinist Church on Baross Street, the Monument to the War Heroes, the Saint Emery Roman Catholic Church and the Chapel of the Holy Dexter on the dr. Óvári Street. Finally, we can finish our tour at the Köcsi Pond in Káptalanfüred where can meet the Red Sandstone Tourist Path again.

Once we wish to bike uphill and a wonderful panorama then we should turn right at the junction of Veszprémi Road and Széchenyi Promenade and follow the cobblestoned street uphill to reach the Quarry Park. There you can have a short rest and bike farther uphill to the Óvári Lookout Tower to admire the wonderful panorama waiting for you.
